Rules and Roles of Committees

General Rules

- Committee Chairperson is appointed by the Board President and is responsible to setting the agenda for committee meetings and presiding over such meetings.
- All proposals/reports from committee members will be forwarded to the Committee Chairperson first for review and then forwarded to the entire committee for review and comment. Once the entire committee approves the proposal/report, the proposal/report will be put on the agenda
- Issues reported by the membership to the Fair Treatment Coordinator and forwarded to the committee will receive top priority by the committee.
- Committees are encouraged to meet via conference call and develop proposals and reports between full Board meetings to promote productive and efficient full Board meetings. Preferably, committees will have approved proposals and reports prior to the full Board meeting and include them on the full Board Meeting agenda.
- On rare occasions, a committee may require action by the full Board prior to a regular full Board meeting. In such a case, the Committee Chairperson will request that the Board President calls a Special Meeting. If the Board President grants the request, the Board President will request the Special Meeting in accordance with the Bylaws. Items worthy of Special Meeting requests include:
 - Reports/Rules needed prior to the next full Board Meeting.
 - Issues forwarded by the Ombuds to the committee requiring immediate resolution.
 - Any other item requiring Board approval prior to the next full Board meeting.

Standing Committee Responsibilities

Committees can only recommend adoption of items in their area of responsibility to the full Board. Full Board approval is required for all changes.

Competition Committee

- Set US Competition Rules and Judging Guidelines
- Update US Competition Rule Book.
- Maintain Competition Scoring Software.
- Oversee US National/Regional Competitions/US World Trials.
- Coordinate USAJR with international jump rope organizations.
- Develop and maintain judge training materials.
- Oversee judge training

Governance Committee

- USAJR operating policies/procedures.
- USAJR Code of Conduct.
- USAJR Bylaws.
- Develop all policies/procedures not covered by other Committees.
- Update and maintain coach training materials.
- Disciplinary Council

Camp Committee

- Review camp sanctions.
- Review and establish rules for camp operations.
- Maintain camp guidelines.
- Review camp staff selections and approve.
- Camp fee schedule.

All Star Committee

- Recommend and execute rules for All Star team selection.

- Screen and select all star coaches.
- Maintain and update All Star Handbook.
- Recommend All Star Team Manager.
- Oversee operations of All Star Team.
- All Star Team Fee Schedule Review
- Update and maintain Skills Training Materials.

Nationals Planning Committee

- Assist Executive Director with logistics of National Tournament.
- Set National Tournament fee.
- Review and update National Tournament registration documents.

Ad Hoc Committee Responsibilities
